





Together, we can ensure that the Monarchs continue to grace our skies and serve as a symbol of hope and resilience for generations to come.

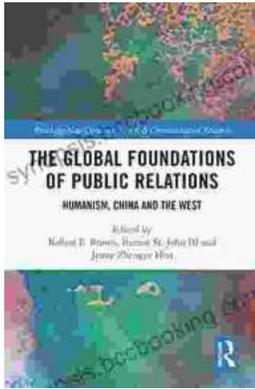
