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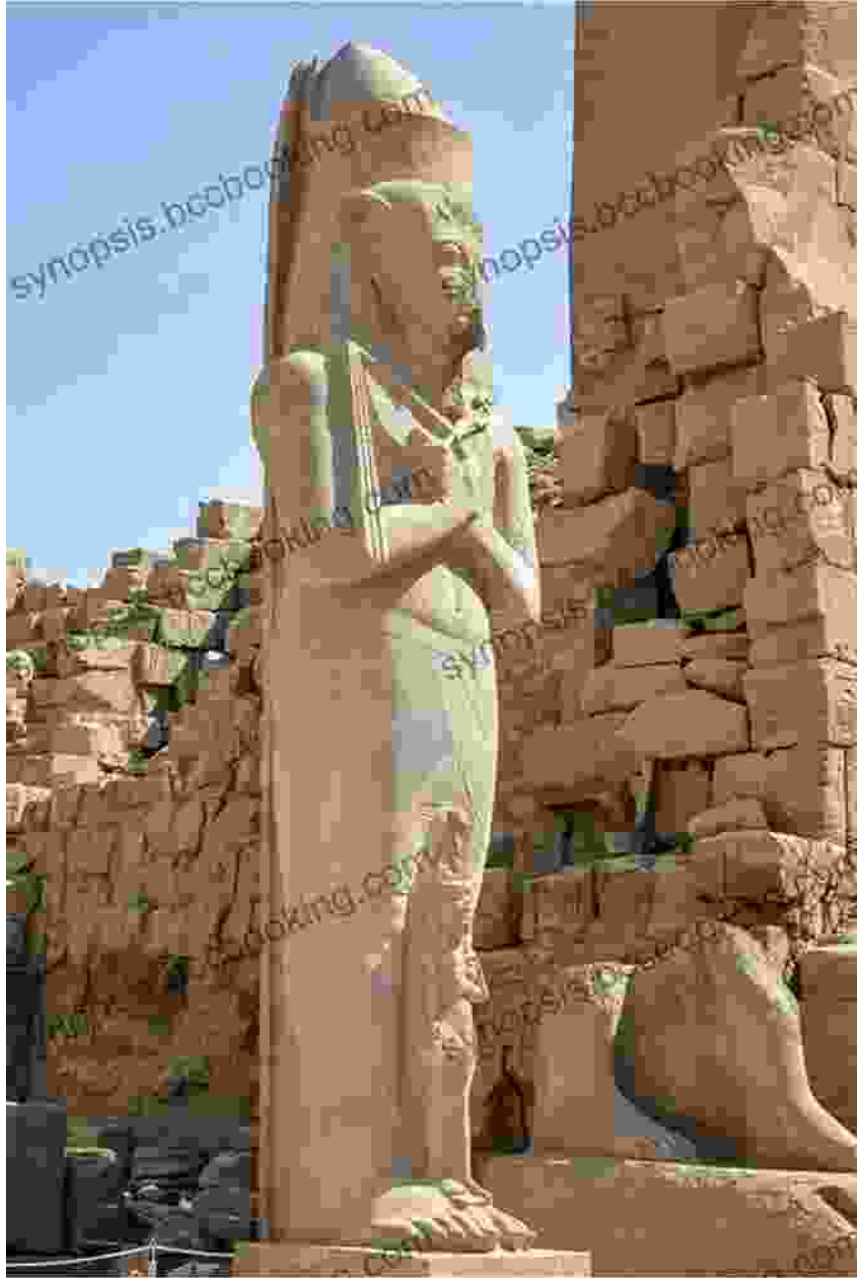


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Tomb of the Augurs, Tarquinia, scene of two Augurs (Priest), with inscription, "The priest, he stands, to pass."

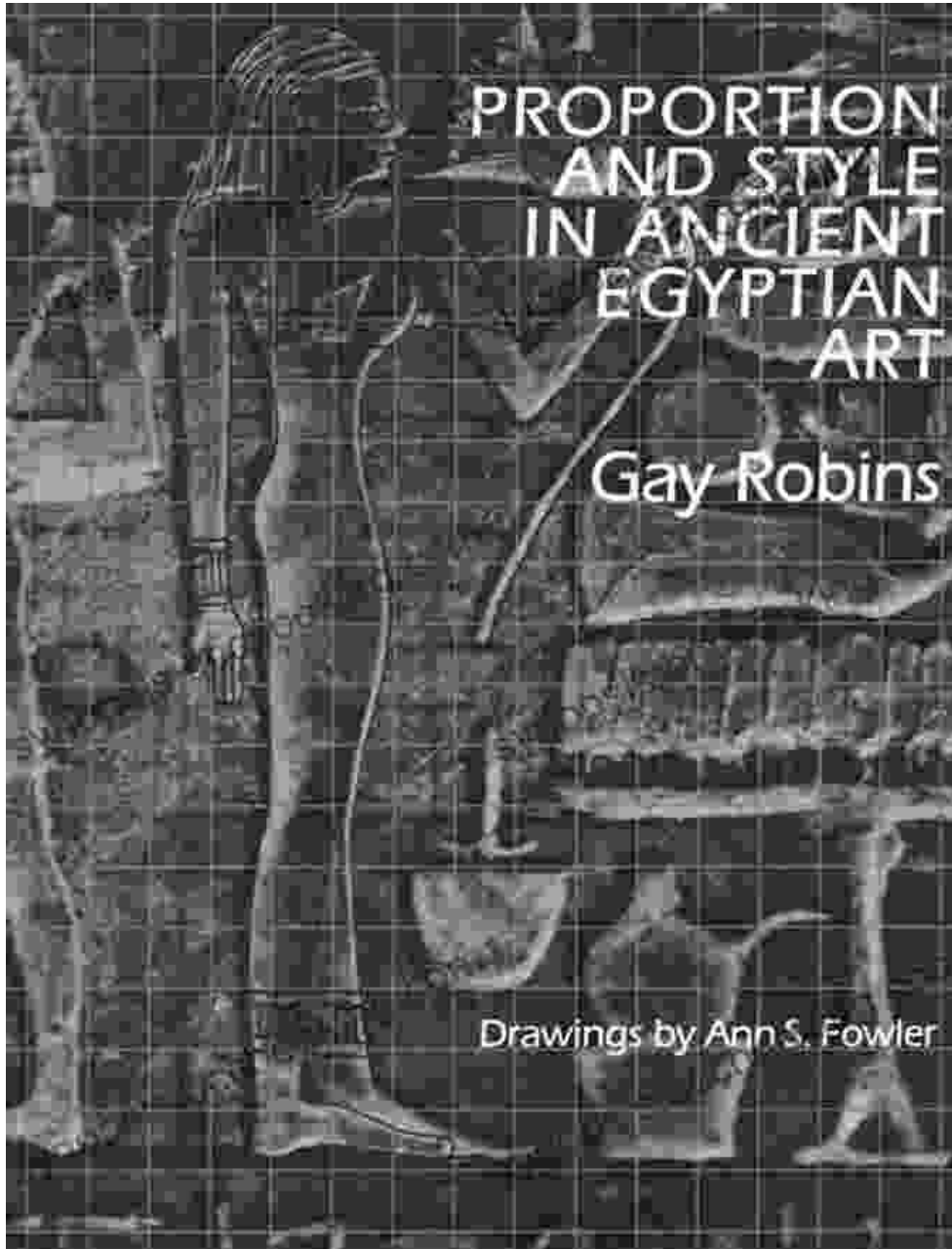
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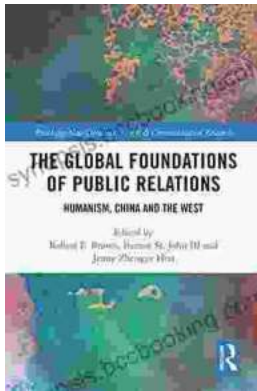
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
